# A. Institutional Activities

#### 1. Saurashtra University North Zone Youth Festival

Saurashtra University North Zone Youth Festival was jointly organized by Saurashtra University & Christ College, Rajkot on September 25 & 26, 2011

The Colleges affiliated to Saurashtra University are divided into two zones - North Zone and South Zone. Christ College, Rajkot was privileged to host the Saurashtra University North Zone Youth Festival on September 25 & 26, 2011. The programme had 34 different events spread over two days and was witnessed by about two thousand students and civilians across the region.

# Academic Activities

# Planning

The College follows a planned academic schedule for the effective implementation of the syllabus. The student-centric teaching-learning methodology practiced by the College ensures enduring learning experiences.

- Heads of the Departments (HoD) are entrusted with the responsibility of preparing the workload and subject distribution at least a month prior to the commencement of the academic year.
- The College Handbook provides the academic calendar of the College and is made available to the students at the beginning of the academic year.
- The College ensures a planned academic schedule. All the faculty members meticulously chalk out a teaching plan as per the University requirements, academic schedule and the guidelines and formats implemented by the College.
- The HoD verifies the academic plan, makes corrections if necessary, and submits it to the Principal for approval. The approved teaching plan is strictly adhered to. However, in case of unforeseen and unavoidable circumstances, an alteration is permitted.
- The College conducts class / unit tests and preliminary examinations. The schedule for the tests is communicated to the students by the concerned faculty and the schedule for the examinations is communicated through the College Handbook.
- Question papers are set as per the pattern (blueprint) of Saurashtra University. The evaluation pattern (blueprint) is explained to the students by the faculty as per the subject requirement at the beginning of the academic year.
- A question bank, prepared and maintained by each department, is made available to the students.

- Activities aimed at holistic development of the students are planned under the banner of departments, clubs and associations
- At the beginning of the academic year, HoDs, in consultation with the faculty members, chalk out a tentative schedule for the departmental activities to be undertaken during the academic year and seek the approval of the Principal.

# Execution





#### **First Year Admissions**









## Activities conducted by the Club

# 1. Free Plant Distribution at College Campus

We reach to Dalhousie, a hill station in Himachal by taking a train from Ahmedabad to Pathankot and then by bus or taxis from there onward. There are plenty of options to stay in Dalhousie as this is a hill station catering to tourists coming round the year from the plains. We have on various occasions stayed in the Youth Hostel Dalhousie is located at 6800 feet above sea level SO in summers also you get cool weather here. First day of the trek started from Banikhet which is near to Dalhousie. There was no snow but environment was very cold it kept increasing the farther we went towards Lakkadmandi which is about 10 kms from Dalhousie. Three kilometers from Lakkadmnadi is the Kalatop Rest House.

The walk from Lakkadmandi to the Kalatop is beautiful and is part of the Kalatop-Khajjiar Reserve forest. For booking the Rest House one has the contact the Divisional Forest Officer, Wildlife, Chamba. Khajjiar lake is saucer shaped surrounded by deodar trees. Over the years the lake has shrunk. It is a really beautiful place which has been a location of shooting of lot of Bollywood films in the earlier years. Khajjiar is also known as the 'Mini Switzerland' of India. The place and surrounding areas is now also a venue for paragliding. At Khajjiar for those who are interested there is horse riding available. The route after Kahjjiar towards Chamba is all downhill - infact too downhill. The route became a bit tortuous as this part of the stretch was not only long but was completely downhill and therefore warmer also. Chamba is located at an altitude of 3268 ft. Overall the trek was enjoyable. On reaching Chamba town we stayed at hotel maintained by the yhai.The main sight seeing places in this ancient town are the Laxmi Naryan temple complex, the Chowgan, Bhuri Singh museum, St Andrew's church. Shailendrasingh Jadeja, Vishal Muliya, Ms. Pintu Bera and Chirantan Rawal mentor students during the trek.

#### 9. Bird Rescue during Uttarayan

Christ collage nature club along with NGO "wild saurashtra" organized 'Bird rescue program' since last 3 years during Uttrayan as an effort to save the injured birds from certain death and giving them a survival chance. This is the chance to help the urban bird life. Every one of us can make a big difference in saving life of innocent feather friends. Counselling is a process that focuses on enhancing the psychological well-being of the client, such that the client is then able to reach their full potential.

**Psychological well-being** is achieved by the counsellor facilitating personal growth, development, and self-understanding in the client, which in turn will empowers the client to adapt more constructive life practices. The counsellors work in a problem-solving manner with the particular issue.

#### Objectives

- 4. To facilitate new behavioural actions

In the beginning of the academic year all the students are given an orientation about counselling and they get an opportunity to interact with the counsellor in the class room or outside the class room. Hence rapport is gradually established and this enables the students to have confidence in the counsellor and share freely and openly.

Students come regularly for the counselling and they do come for the follow up sessions. The timing for the counselling is from 12 pm to 2 pm in the afternoon. Students usually take prior appointments or they do come as and when they need counselling.
