Grandmaster - Chess

10-minute rapid chess is a popular time control because it allows players to think more deeply about their moves than in blitz chess, but it is still fast-paced enough to be exciting. It is a good choice for players who want to improve their chess skills without having to spend hours playing each game.

The rules of 10-minute rapid chess are the same as the rules of standard chess, with the following exceptions:

- 1. Each player has 10 minutes to complete the game.
- 2. Participants should install a chess timer clock in their mobile. And that timer clock will be used for the game.
- 3. The game is won by checkmate, resignation, or the expiration of the time on one player's clock.
- 4. If both players' clocks expire at the same time, the game is a draw.
- 5. En passant rule is applicable for pawns. The rule ensures that a pawn cannot use its two-square move to safely skip past an enemy pawn.
- 6. Players are not allowed to make any illegal moves.
- 7. Players are not allowed to touch any of the pieces on the board except for the piece they are moving. Touching a piece means, the player has to move the same piece.
- 8. Players are not allowed to make any unnecessary delays.
- 9. Players are not allowed to communicate with each other during the game.
- 10. Use your time wisely. Don't spend too much time on each move, but don't rush either.
- 11. Look for tactical opportunities. In 10-minute rapid chess, there is less time for positional play, so you need to be more aggressive and look for ways to win material or checkmate your opponent.
- 12. Be aware of the clock. Don't let your time run out!
- 13. Practice regularly. The more you play, the better you will get at playing 10-minute rapid chess.
